• Total budget for marching band was \$22,000.00, but we only spent \$20,000.00.

- Matt has been watching the progression of the percussion and color guard shows through their many practices. They are coming along on schedule, and the students are working hard.
- We will be performing for MICCA this year. This is a performance in which concert band and orchestra participates in. It gives the students an opportunity to play in front of judges as well as perform. This event will take place Friday, April 5th at 7:30 pm at Bellingham High School
 - MICCA Concert Festivals encourage the improvement of a group's musical standards by providing musical adjudication by highly qualified adjudicators. Attendance at a festival also affords organizations an opportunity to hear performances by other groups and experience the presentation of a wide variety of musical literature..
- Our March Band concert will take place on March 20th at 6:30. All the schools will be in participation. Band seniors will be recognized on this night.
- Home Show will be taking place on March 23rd. As of right now, we have 31 groups signed up. This is a perfect number of groups for us to handle in the High School.

Secretary Report

- Gillette Update- we are winding down our season. This weekend we have our first playoff game. If we win this game and Kansas loses, we will play again the following weekend. This is another \$4000.00 more that was not added to our expected Gillette revenue in the spring. Our BBQ140 booth has now been approved for 15 volunteers, that a minimum of \$1500.00 per event. We also house BBQ140 Hot Chocolate and provide 4 volunteers (winter only) \$400.00 more each time. When you add tips we made over \$2000.00 per event.
 - o So far this year we have had 28 events, with \$53,221.44 in revenues
 - o \$11,4000.00 of that revenue were student credits to give us a total profit of \$41,821.44 before the playoff games.
 - o A Gillette Meeting has been postponed but will be taking place to take over Gillette for the 2019-2020 season. Date is TBD.
- **Scholarship** application is due to the guidance department as well as some crucial due dates coming up like, who will present them, who will decide which applicants get the scholarships, etc.. Michelle Fine and Kim O'Neill volunteered to update the information and get in touch with Denise MacKillop.
- **Home Show meeting** must take place to start the planning stages of the event that will need lots of hands to make the day run smoothly especially our ad book! We will have a meeting while enjoying dinner at our dinner fundraiser at Bella Sarno, Wednesday, January 16th at 7:00.

• Yankee Candle is now officially closed for the season. Sales was \$1641.00, our profit check was \$656.40. Half was online sales \$351.00, and half was catalog sales \$304.00.

Other Items

- Monthly Restaurant Fundraiser At Papa Gino's we made \$68.71, and at Jake N Joes we made \$95.24. This month we will be having it at Bella Sarno on Wednesday, January 16th from 4pm-9pm in North Attleboro for dine in or take out. February will be on Wednesday the 6th at Fresh Catch from noon-8pm for dine in or take out. March will be on Tuesday the 12th at Decos Pizza from 11am-10pm for dine in or take out. April will be on Monday the 29th at Jimmy's Pub from 4:00pm-9:00pm dine in or take out. May will be at Home Plate in Norton, details to come.
- Murder Mystery Fundraising Event Nancy LeBlanc got information about a night out spring event for us to host at the Mansfield Elks. This would make quite a few dollars for the band program. The company, charges \$1699 and we would charge \$50 per person. This price would include dinner like pizza and salads. Everyone decided at the meeting that we should go ahead and try planning this event hoping to at least selling 50 tickets to break even. Michelle motioned to go forward with a deposit down for the murder mystery night, Barbara Mosca seconded it, all were in favor, the voted passed.
- We will make a little over \$3000 if we sell all 120 tickets not including raffle items. Meeting adjourned at 8:13
